Set app permissions


- Previously - set app permissions for the types of info an app could access on your system, including:
 - your location,
 - camera,
 - microphone
 - and files.
- Now, peruse a handy list of installed apps and set permission for each app.
- Perform the following:
 1. Go to Settings > Apps > Apps & features,
 2. Select an app,
 3. Click Advanced options,
 4. Use the toggle switches to set an app's permissions.

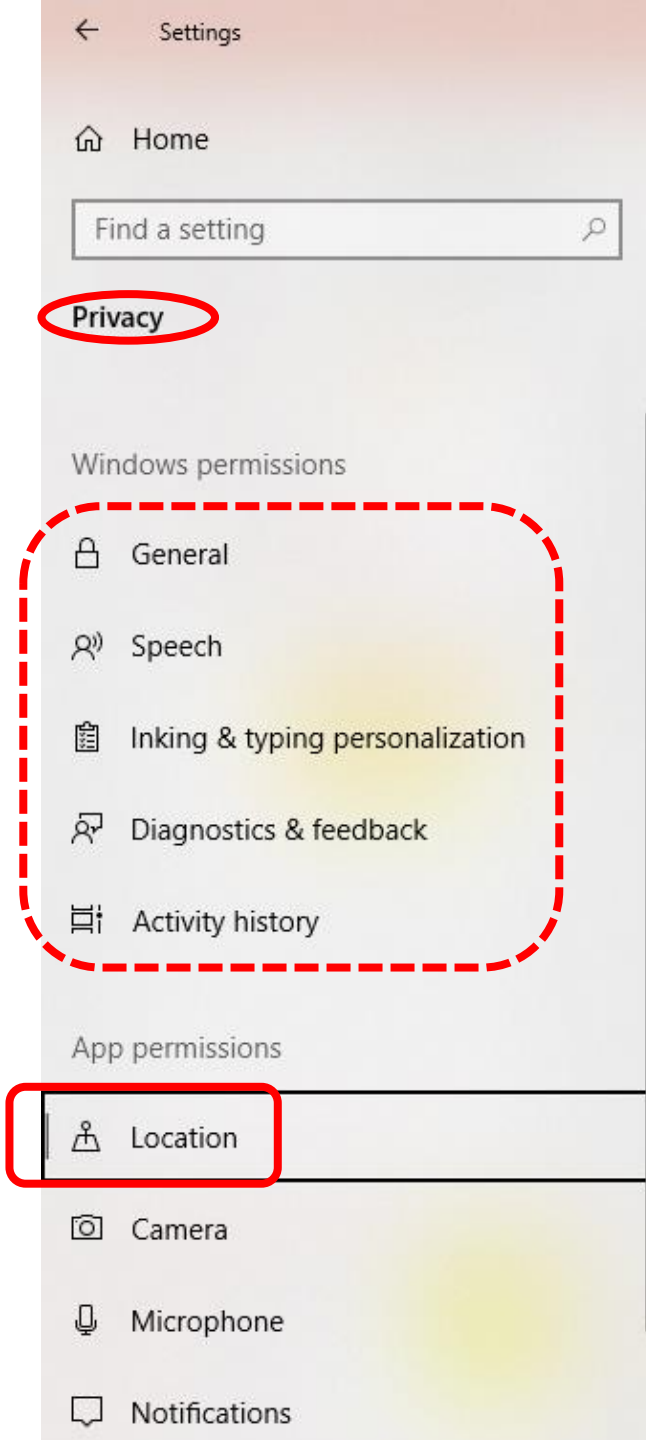

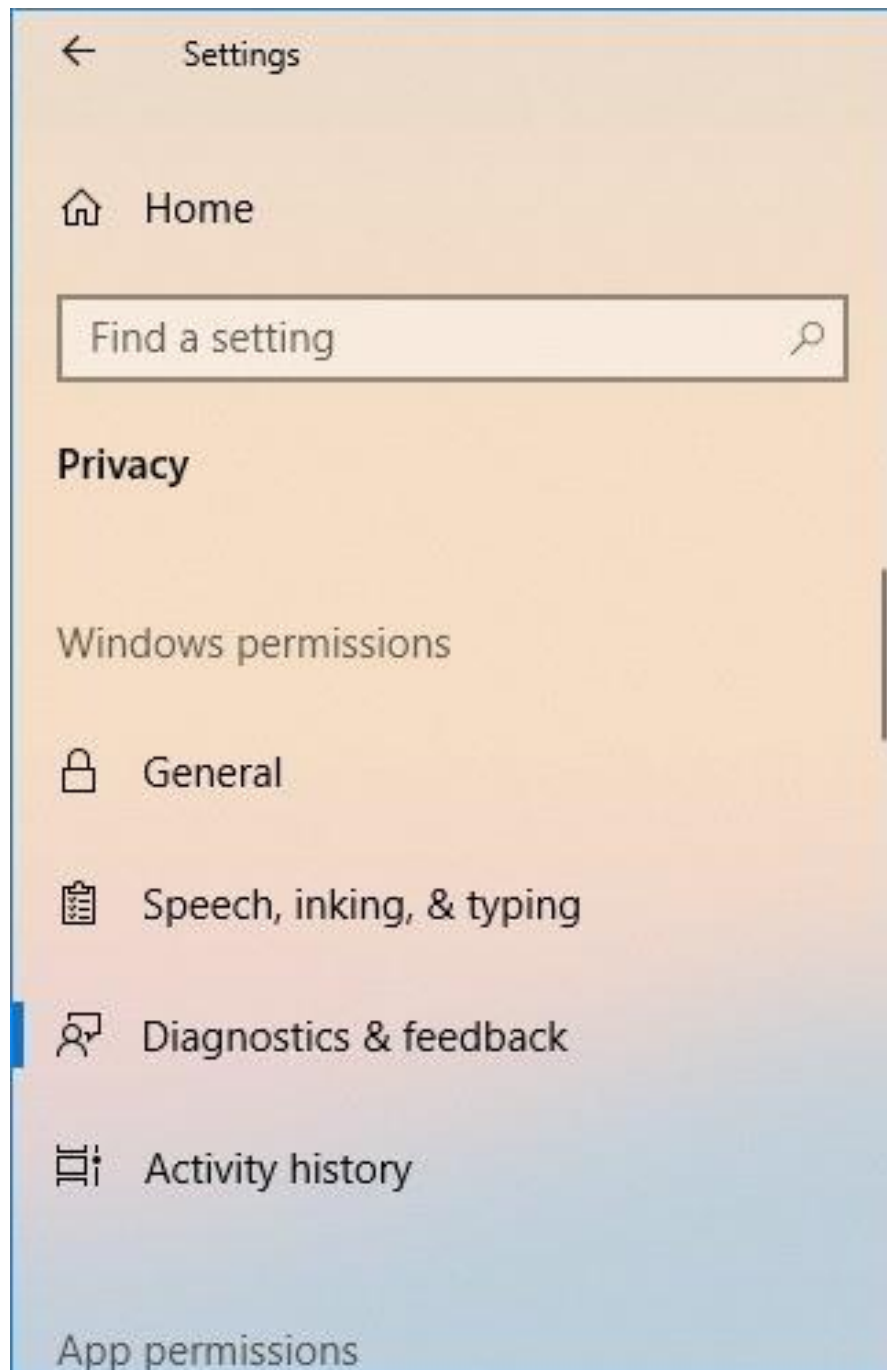
