**Amazon Web Services Outage Dec 7, 2021** Amazon's Web Services (AWS) suffered a major worldwide outage on Tuesday, Dec 7th. I first discovered it the morning of Dec 7th when all of a sudden my Artificial intelligence (AI) Assistant Alexa would not respond to any commands. I then tried my Google Assistant and had no problem. That is when it became clear to me that I had made the correct choice in having a Smart Home with both Amazon's Alexa and Google's Assistant. In making that choice I also made sure that my choice of brands for smart plugs and smart bulbs would work with either assistant. As with most technical stuff it is always best to have a backup in case of a system failure. Once Alexa started not responding I went to a site called [downdetector.com](http://downdetector.com) to find out what was happening and the scope of the problem. This excellent site monitors online service providers to help us understand what's going on with an outage and provides real-time insights into the problems. ### Microsoft Testing Voice Control in Windows 11

Microsoft is currently testing Voice Control access in the Dev channel for Windows 11. It will be a while before this feature makes it into release builds of the Operating System. But once it does it could be quite exciting. It would allow people with mobility disabilities (along with the rest of us) to control our PCs and write text using our voice. No longer would we need to touch a mouse or keyboard to navigate around screens. ### Windows 11 is Now on Almost 9 Percent of PCs

AdDuplex reports that as of Nov 30, 2021 Windows 11 is on 8.9% of PC's worldwide. That is a jump of almost 5% from October. All versions of Win 10 were at 91.1% with ver 21H2 at 3.7%, ver 21H1 at 36.3%, and ver 20H2 at 31.8%. This data was obtained by AdDuplex surveying around 60,000 Win 10 and 11 Pcs

Cool smartphone Apps you may not know about include:

**SkySafari**-point your phone at the night sky and get info on thousands of planets and if you are up for a history lesson, it can also simulate the night sky from anywhere on earth at any time.

**Magnifying glass**-most phones have it built in or you can download an app for it.

**Tape measure**-the phone's built in camera and augmented reality can calculate distance using the AR Measure app among others.

**UV meter**-The EPA has created an app called the SunWise UV index that uses data from your GPS to determine your UV index.
